- 1. Stay true to your university mission
- 2. Do not make transfer students repeat courses in Gen Ed. Do not make them take more than the required amount of courses.
- 3. Ask yourselves "What is it that students (regardless or discipline) all share that is common at your university?" This will allow you to have a clear idea of signature course requirements and appropriate Gen Ed. application.
- 4. What does a college educated student need to know. Ex: Math people love math, but does every student need to know exponential functions? Can a framework be developed such as Mathematical Literacy, which would encompass various topics, i.e., College Algebra, Exponential Functions and Statistics?
- 5. Universities should work with their K12 colleagues to help them prepare students for their requirements.
- 6. There is flexibility in the COMAR requirements.
- 7. Communication among sending and receiving institutions is critical and should be mandated. Be mindful that the student is in the middle of all of this.
