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Steps in the Collaborative process:



Brainstorm What do we envison? Why are we doing it?

How? What? Where? When? Who?

Implementation

Timeline (then revised timeline!) & Writing

Edit

Compile & address any issues

Publish

Review, review, review! Then publish and then make another round of edits $\textcircled{\sc o}$

What did we envision?

Sexuality Social Justice Book

Our Why

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• Accessibility

- Highlight authors' voices (including students)
- Welcome format/style of submissions (not just academic style textbook)
 Control and decision-making power

Brainstorm

What do you envision?

Small group discussions:

• What are your ideas?

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 Is OER best? And what kind/type?

What is your why?

Small group discussions:

• Why OER? i.e. is this the best option?

How? What? Where? When? Who?

Find people who can help (and want to do the work)!

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Our Planning TipsDon't be afraid to say that

you need to pivot or adjust

• Don't be afraid to reach out

make sure you can commit

to grant schedule

timeline

OER platforms

- Any you are familiar with?
- Is there grant money and how do you get it?

Plan

Discussion:

- What aspects of your plan do you have thought out? (it is okay to say none!)
- What do you need help figuring out? Use this time!

Be realistic

(with self and others)

Timeline

Be prepared to revisit and check in with authors frequently

Implement

Tips

Remember (and remind each other) this can be updated easily so not everything needs to be included in this first publication

Small group discussion:

What do you think will be one of your barriers to implementation? Discuss strategies to combat it! **Create guidelines for** editing Basic ideas were agreed to in the planning phase (this helped!)

Determine what is essential & what is optional Communicate this with authors

Edit

Our guidelines included:

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- Limited editing of own friends' chapters
 Kept essence of author's
- ideas
- Peer reviewed, but not blind •

Things to consider:

- How do you envision the editing section? Who will do what?
- Some of this is determined in the planning stage!

Review, Review, Review

- Use an accessible word doc
 Time consuming process! (& requires attention to detail)
